Rural Infill Costs - \$8,250.00 Urban Infill Costs - \$5,000.00 This Construction Season, crews will be focused on the replowing of pipe at Tap 30 (North of Sylvan Lake); continue replowing at Tap 20 (SW of Bentley) and replowing at Tap 120 (NE of Crestomere).

Tap Definition: A device that controls the flow of gas through a pipe from it's supply source

Replacing aging infrastructure is crucial to mitigate gas loss and meet growing consumer demand.

Meter Recall Program - As part of our routine inspection and maintenance schedule, the Meter Recall Program for 2025 is near completion. *We would like to extend our sincere thanks to all affected members for their cooperation, which is invaluable to our service staff working in the field.*

Right of Way Survey & Leak **Detection:** Every summer we engage a 3rd party leak detection conduct leak contractor to detection and right of way patrols on all high-pressure pipelines annually and low pressure lines on a 5-year rotation. You will see Gas Recon out conducting surveys through June and July, weather depending. We supply G.L.D.C. magnetic signs to the crews for identification. - Possible Mail Strike: With the possibility of a postal strike, there may be delays in mail delivery. Should this occur, please be aware that payment due dates and applicable late fees will remain unchanged. To help ensure your payments are received on time and to avoid any service interruptions, we encourage you to plan ahead and consider using alternative methods to receive and pay your bills.
 - <u>Alternate payment options</u>. online banking, payment at a banking institution, credit card, in-person payment/drop box at our office location in Rimbey and drop boxes set up at the Rimbey Value Drug Mart, Gull Lake Wooden Shoe and Bentley IDA.

Damage Prevention Charges

- Know the Smell of Natural Gas: Natural gas is odorless, but we add an agent known as mercaptan, a distinct "rotten egg" smell, to help detect leaks. If you smell gas, leave the area immediately and call your Gas Co-op or emergency services from a safe location.
- Watch out for One Another: In the event of a gas emergency, your awareness could make all the difference; not just for your own safety, but for your neighbors' as well. If you notice anything unusual, such as the smell of gas or signs of a leak near a neighboring home, please act quickly. Safety is a shared responsibility, and a caring community is a safer one.
